Short Narrative Description of Research, Teaching and Service Interests

Research: As a scholar of Latin American literature and culture, and a creative writer, I work towards unveiling how literary and cultural traditions are formed, circulated, and followed amidst culturally-, politically-, and socially specific surroundings. My current research on Brazilian cultural and literary production uncovers Brazil's deep-rooted and continuing whitening process since the abolition of slavery in 1888. This process aims to erase Blackness and is imposed upon afro-Brazilian artistic production within literature and beyond. By examining, nineteenth-century afro-Brazilian author Machado de Assis's works and reception, Brazilian Hip-Hop, and contemporary underrepresented afro-Brazilian women writers, I demonstrate that, until very recently, mainstream scholarship in Brazil either ignores Blackness or renders it unimportant as a constituent element of Brazilian and afro-Brazilian literary and cultural production. My research highlights how afro-Brazilian authors deploy unique aesthetic approaches in order to accurately depict black people's shared social and cultural practices and experiences, which are directly related to the legacies of slavery. I thus reveal the presence of Blackness as a central element of Brazilian cultural production.

Teaching: In my classes I set three main closely linked learning goals: students will carry out effective inquiry; they will be exposed to and engage with diversity; and they will recognize the value of studying language, literature, and culture in order to interpret the world's continuous intersections between local and global communities. I started working at UNM in 2019 after previously working at a teaching institution for four years. Ever since, I have been regularly teaching one or two courses per semester. I have taught **five** cross-listed 400/500 level courses on Brazilian literature and culture, **two** core survey courses, and **three** topics courses. In addition to teaching the surveys and film course already listed in the UNM catalog, I have developed two courses that enrich the curriculum: "Being Black in Brazil" and "Machado de Assis, Race, and Literature." Both courses address racial issues explicitly and in depth in ways that the established courses cannot. These courses, therefore, provide students with a more complete picture of Brazilian literature and culture. Of my unique approach to the field, a student wrote: "He shows personal concern for the student, yet still maintaining a professional-like setting." My students' success is a direct reflection of the environment I build in my classroom: a stress-free atmosphere where everyone feels comfortable to freely experience the possibilities of the subject at hand.

Service: My history of service started at Stephen F Austin State University where I was elected for the Faculty Senate, and I served on my College's Council. At UNM, at first, my service efforts were directed towards addressing the needs of the Portuguese program an upholding the program's internationally praised reputation. I served as the coordinator for two years and head of section for three years, during difficult times, including the COVID-19 pandemic. I have also served on several departmental committees, such as the graduate, the advisory, and the undergraduate committees, M.A. exam committees (2), one PhD dissertation committee, and an ad hoc search committee. Currently I serve as Director of Undergraduate Studies. I have also served the greater university on the Operations Committee of the Latin American and Iberian Institute. I have completed extensive service to the profession. I have reviewed for top journals in my field and held the positions of Executive Director and President of The Southwest Council of Latin American Studies [SCOLAS](#). I am also a member of the executive committees of two key organizations in my field: American Portuguese Studies Association [APSA](#) and Brazilian Studies Association [BRASA](#). Finally, I serve as member of the executive committee of the Modern Language Association's Luso Brazilian Forum. The main goal that I pursue and have steadily accomplished in every position is to promote diversity and inclusion, particularly regarding African diasporic topics and peoples and Hispanic-Serving aspirations.
