UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM - SPANISH & PORTUGUESE BA

Program Goal #1:

<u>Knowledge</u>: Students demonstrate a breadth and depth of knowledge of Spanish, Latin American, and or Latinx Languages, cultures, and literatures, and can explain multiple perspectives on related topics.

SLO 1.1. Students describe a variety of topics related to Spanish, Latin American, and/or Latinx communities and languages.

SLO 1.2. Students show understanding of phenomena in Spanish, Latin American, and/or Latinx cultures, histories, and languages with emphasis on diversity.

Program Goal #2:

<u>Critical, Analytical, and Introspective Thinking</u>: Students use critical, analytical, and introspective thinking to cultivate well-informed viewpoints about data, texts, and cultural practices.

SLO 2.1. I can analyze texts, data, perspectives, and practices related to Spanish, Latin American, and/or Latinx communities.

SLO 2.2. Students evaluate perspectives and interpretations of cultural and linguistic texts and data in Spanish, Latin American, and/or Latinx communities and defend my point of view.

Program Goal #3:

<u>Transformative Communication</u>: Students use transformative intercultural communication practices in spoken, written, and/or embodied Spanish / Portuguese, using language practices that promote pluralism and social justice.

Program Goal #4:
