GRADUATE PROGRAM - SPANISH & PORTUGUESE MA and DUAL

Program Goal #1:

Students will acquire a broad knowledge of the Hispanic and/or Lusophone language, literatures, and cultures:

SLO 1.1: Students accurately describe a broad range of literary and cultural primary texts, or linguistic theories and phenomena.
